

- Salt Lake County boasts a population of over 1,000,000. Approximately 11-13% of the county's population was born on foreign soil. Cities that contain the larger percentages of foreign births are West Valley City, Taylorsville, South Salt Lake, Kerns & Magna. Birth countries include Vietnam (4000+), mainland China (3000+), India (2500+), Bosnia (2500+), Brazil (1700+), Guatemala (2500+), Mexico (50,000+) and so forth.
- The most recent US Census data shows that about 120 languages are now spoken in Utah, with Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese and Pacific Island languages among the top in the state. About 14% of Utah residents speak a language other than English at home. In Salt Lake County, that number was about 20% of the population. Spanish is by far the most popular language spoken after English in Utah, with about 246,000 speakers. About 13,000 people speak languages that originate in the Pacific Islands, such as Tongan and Samoan.
- Utah is home to around 35,000 refugees, with about 1,000 new refugees arriving each year. 97% of the Utah refugee population resides in Salt Lake County.
- According to the *Utah Refugee Services Office*, there are about 5000 Sudanese, 5000 Somali and 5000 Bosnian refugees that make up most of the refugee population. The rest is primarily made of refugees from Burma, Bhutan, Iraq, Iran, Liberia, Rwanda, Burundi and Sierra Leone.
- Census stats indicate that during the last decade, every year an average of 1,100 refugees were resettled along the Wasatch Front and 10,000 other immigrants moved here.
- Local organizations that work with refugees and immigrants report that they work with people from over 40 different countries. People from Afghanistan, Bhutan, Bosnia, Bulgaria, Burma (Myanmar), Burundi, Cambodia, China, Columbia, Congo, Cuba, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, Eritrea, Guatemala, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kenya, Liberia, Mexico, Pakistan, Peru, Romania, Russia, Rwanda, Somalia, Sudan, Sudan, Togo, Vietnam and many others.
- According to *The Association of Religion Data Archives*, some of the most active religious adherents in Salt Lake County are as follows: LDS (610,000+), Catholic (84,000+), Buddhist (3700+), Muslim (4500+). Less than 2% of the population in Utah claims to be Evangelical.
